In the Italian war of 1860, he gallantly took up arms with the Irish Papal Brigade St Patrick in defence of the chair of St Peter and gained for himself laurels which were publicly acknowledged by Pope Pius IX in electing and proclaiming him Knight of of the order of St. This monument is erected as a tribute to his amiable and sterling qualities In of his private and in Ireland
